bequest

Nola and Robert Addinall were members of the Broken Bay Uniting Church. Nola was a Church Elder who loved to share her talent for singing, especially at Parish concerts. Their bequest reflects the importance of the Church in their lives.

They moved to Point Clare in the 1980's. The Addinall's did not have children and appointed their niece, Helen Harvey, as Legal Guardian. Helen's father was Robert's elder brother.

In 2012, the Addinall's health was deteriorating and specialised care became necessary. Helen came down from Tamworth to make appropriate arrangements for their changing situations. In September, they were both welcomed into Baptist Care Orana, where Robert was accommodated in the nursing home section and Nola was in the low dependency section. Robert passed away on 25th October and Rev. Peter Swain conducted his funeral at Umina Uniting Church on 1st November 2012.

Nola was well cared for at Orana for 9 years. Joan and Peter Swain were regular visitors and kept in touch with Helen Harvey who visited Nola as often as she could. Nola faced the challenge of dementia in her final years and she passed away peacefully on August 10th, 2021, aged ninety-one.

The Parish thanks Helen Harvey for her care towards Nola and Robert. As Executrix, she oversaw the transfer of the Addinall's generous financial gift to our church.
